# NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND **DELEGATES**

# **BRANCH 351 OLYMPIA, WASHINGTON**

This is an official notice to the membership of Branch 351 that nominations for the positions listed below and Delegates to the 2025 Washington State Convention are open. The Branch President will be an automatic delegate to the State Conventions that will take place during the President's term of office.

Nominations for officers and convention delegates of Branch 351 will be held at the regular Branch meetings on October 2nd; November 6th, 2024, 7:00 PM, at 906 Columbia St SW suite 206, Olympia, WA 98501.

All Branch 351 members are eligible for nomination, with the exception of those in supervisory positions or within two years following termination of supervisory status. Nominees must attend six of the twelve meetings before the convention to be eligible as expenses-paid Convention Delegates. Nominations will be received from the floor or may be submitted in writing. Nominees must be present to accept or may indicate their acceptance in writing. Written nominations must be in the possession of the Recording Secretary no later than 8:00 PM, November 6, 2024. The election will be conducted by secret mail ballot (if a position has two nominations). The ballots will be mailed to all eligible members at least 20 days before the election. The election will be held on December 4, 2024. Ballots must be received no later than 7:00 PM, the day of the election. Write -in ballots will not be counted for any position but will not cause the entire ballot to be invalidated.

Current Language:
Article V Section 8a. For their expenses. except as authorized under Article V, Sections 4, 5, and 6, the following officers shall be reimbursed for their expenses the following sums per year at the end of the year: President \$1,100.00, Vice-President \$200.00 plus \$50.00 per meeting chaired, Secretary-Treasurer \$1,400.00, Recording-Secretary \$800.00, Editor \$1000.00, Director of Media \$800.00, Sergeant at Arms \$250.00, Director of Retirees-\$300.00, Director of Community

Services and each Trustee \$300.00. These changes would be effective in calendar year 2020.

#### Proposed new language:

Article V Section 8a. For their expenses. except as authorized under Article V, Sections 4, 5, and 6, the following officers shall be reimbursed for their expenses the following sums per month: President \$100.00, Vice-President \$20.00 plus \$50.00 per meeting chaired, Secretary-Treasurer \$125.00, Recording-Secretary \$75.00, Editor \$100, Director of Media \$75.00, Sergeant at Arms \$25.00, Director of Retirees-\$25.00, Director of Community Services and each Trustee \$30.00. These changes would be effective in calendar year 2024.

## **Presidents Report**

### Constitution Of the National Association of Letter Carriers of The United States of America

Organized at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 1889 Affiliated with the American Federation of Labor, September 20, 1917 Affiliated with the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations, December 5, 1955

ARTICLE 1 Name, Powers and Objectives

Section 1. This labor organization, hereinafter referred to as the Union, shall be known as the 4 National Association of Letter Carriers of the United States of America and shall be identified by the initials NALC.

Sec. 2. This document shall be known as the Constitution of the National Association of Letter Carriers, Constitution for the Government of Subordinate and Federal Branches, Constitution for the Government of State Associations, Constitution and General Laws of the United States Letter Carriers Mutual Benefit Association and Health Benefit Plan.

Sec. 3. The Union shall have jurisdiction to make its own Constitution, Rules of Discipline and General Laws of the United States Letter Carriers Mutual Benefit Association and Health Benefit Plan.


Sec. 4. The National Convention shall be the supreme body to which final appeal shall be made on all matters emanating from Members, Branches and State Associations. There shall be no geographical limitations on the jurisdiction of the Union.

Sec. 5. The objects of the Association shall be: to unite all letter carriers and other employees of the Postal Service for their mutual benefit; to obtain and secure our rights as employees of the United States Postal Service and to strive at all times to promote the safety and the welfare of every member.

Members are aware of the National Agreement, but have little to no, knowledge of our Constitution. The Constitution governs how the Union, State Associations, and Branches are to operate. The National Agreement is exactly as it states, the negotiated agreement between the Union and the USPS. The Agreement controls the wages, hours and working conditions.

I mention this because all members must understand. the Union function because of its members and for its members. When you participate and give your input, our National Officers utilize what you say when trying to negotiate the National Agreement. As a member of the Union, you have the right to attend your Branch meetings and express yourself on issues on your mind. For example, you would like to see if something could be negotiated by our National Officers for the National Contract. To do that you need to attend a branch meeting and bring it up. It's possible that, which would be known as a National Agreement Resolution, had already been brought up and voted on at a Convention. Do understand, there is a progression to what one would like to have negotiated. You bring it up at a Branch meeting and if the motion pass, then it will go before the State Association, where at the State Convention, the delegates present would vote.

The main thing behind what I am mentioning, is that as a member, you have the right to attend and to participate. Exercise that right!!!
